Boni Libri Reading Card

Boni Libri requires each student to read one book per six weeks. Due dates are shown on the school calendar at www.ChristClassical.com. The book must be chosen from the CCA Reading List or be approved by your teacher. When you finish a book, you are to complete a 4 x 6 card and hand it in to your teacher, on or before the due date. Grammar school students shall hand write the report on the card. Logic and Rhetoric school students may type the report on the card.

At the top of the front side of the card, write the title of the book, the author, your grade level, and number of pages in the book. Beneath this, you should list the main characters and describe each of them. On the back of the card, write a brief summary of the book.

The following is an **example** of a reading card (front and back):

Little House in the Big Woods by Laura Ingalls Wilder	Student Name: <i>My Name Here</i> Student Grade Level: 3 Pages: 205
Laura: a young girl who grew up in Wisconsin in a little house her father built. She lives there with her Ma, Pa, and two sisters.	
Ma (Caroline): Laura's ma. She sewed and cooked for her family. She kept the house neat and made sure everyone had everything they needed.	
Pa (Charles): Laura's pa. He killed the family's food and smoked it to preserve it. He traded furs and played the fiddle to entertain the family.	
Mary: Laura's older sister.	
Carrie: Mary's younger sister.	

Little House in the Big Woods is a book about a family who lived isolated in the big woods of Wisconsin. Laura tells about the many adventures she shared with her family. The reader learns about how the family uses every part of the animals they kill for food, clothes, or toys. The reader also learns about their encounters with bears and other wild animals. The reader also shares the fun experiences with Laura such as when she and her cousins make pictures in the snow.
I liked it when Pa sang to the girls and told them stories. It reminds me of when my Daddy tells me stories. I am glad that I do not have to wear a bonnet like Laura did. I am also glad that we can go to the store to buy our food.
